JOB SUMMARY

Certified Court Interpreters perform literal and general interpretation in Superior Court proceedings and interviews requiring fluency in English and a foreign language. Court Interpreters may also be called upon to provide sight translations of court documents (reading written texts and giving an oral translation of text). This classification performs duties as an interpreter in the courtroom and in other legal proceedings. Individuals appointed to this classification must be certified as a Court Interpreter in the State of California. Possession of a valid certificate as a Court Interpreter in the State of California and possession of a valid Class C California Driver's License is required at the time of appointment.

All application materials will be reviewed. The candidates with background and experience that are considered the best fit for the needs of the Court will be submitted to the interview panel for consideration. Applicants may be required to participate in one or more interview panels and a written exercise during the decision-making process. Please note that Court employment is contingent upon successful completion of a background check, a drug screen test and the provision of appropriate identifying documents to certify eligibility to work in the United States.
